Learning the craft of handmade clay pottery from her husband, combined her skills with training from JSLPS (Jharkhand State Livelihood Promotion Society) in handicraft production. As demand for eco-friendly clay pots grew in her village, she saw an opportunity—not just to earn, but to build a business in her own name.

Her journey took a pivotal turn when she encountered a BYST door-to-door campaign in her village. Motivated by their message, she sought guidance and underwent entrepreneurial training. With help from BYST mentor Mr. Devendra Singh Saluja, she refined her craft, learned the basics of business management, and introduced innovative products like colorful Diyas, clay water bottles, and decorative pots. To boost production, Babita secured a ₹1 lakh loan from Bank of India with the support from BYST, which enabled her to purchase a motor wheel, drastically improving efficiency and output. What began as a small clay pot unit is now a growing enterprise with an annual turnover of ₹5 lakhs. Her unit not only uplifts her family but also provides employment to two women and two men from her community—creating local livelihoods and preserving traditional art. Babita Devi's story is a powerful example of inclusive entrepreneurship, where traditional knowledge, modern mentorship, and community support come together to spark rural transformation. From laborer to local business leader, she has proven that with the right opportunity, anyone can shape their future—just like clay in the hands of a skilled artisan.
